RESOLUTION NO. 2020 BCC 09

RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO NATIONAL POPULAR VOTE COMPACT, WHICH WILL APPEAR ON THE 2020 GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT

WHEREAS, America's Founding Fathers created a system of checks and balances to ensure that each state would have a unique voice in the election of a President; and that no city, state, or region would consolidate too much political power; and

WHEREAS, adoption of the National Popular Vote compact concentrates political power in a few large cities located in the most populous states; and

WHEREAS, Colorado's 9 Electoral Votes are highly coveted and pursued by presidential candidates, ensuring candidates listen to Colorado's unique interests on issues such as water, infrastructure, and taxes; and

WHEREAS, requiring Colorado's Presidential Electors to cast their votes this way would give away Colorado's votes for President to more populated areas like Chicago, Los Angeles, New York and Washington, D.C., relegating Colorado's electorate to a mere bit play in Presidential elections; and

WHEREAS, National Popular Vote compact contains no majority requirement and would allow a candidate with a plurality, however small, to become President;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Morgan County Commissioners officially declares its opposition to National Popular Vote compact for the purpose of ensuring proper checks and balances against accumulation of political power and to protect Colorado's unique political voice in presidential politics.

WHEREAS, the County does not desire to issue a separate permit for use of highways under its jurisdiction, but desires to permit overweight vehicles on highways under the County's jurisdiction with a valid state permit, issued pursuant to C.R.S. § 42-4-510;

WHEREAS, all requirements for a local authority to adopt an overweight vehicle permitting process and fee schedule as identified in C.R.S. §§ 42-4-510 and 42-4-511 have been satisfied; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing on this matter was held by the Board on April 21, 2020.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Morgan County Board of County Commissioners as follows:

- <u>Section 1.</u> **Overweight Divisible Load Vehicles State Permit Accepted.** Any vehicle with a divisible load exceeding a total weight set by the State of Colorado, but not exceed the maximum weight as set by the State of Colorado, may operate on highways under the County's jurisdiction with a valid state permit issued pursuant to C.R.S. § 42-4-510.
- Section 2. County Highways. By this resolution, any vehicle meeting the criteria under Section 1 of this Resolution, may operate on any highway under the County's jurisdiction.

RESOLUTION NO. 2012 BCC 24

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE REGULATION OF OVERWEIGHT DIVISIBLE LOAD VEHICLE TRAVELING ON ROADS WITHIN THE JURISDICTION OF MORGAN COUNTY

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. § 42-4-510, the Board of County Commissioners of Morgan County (the "Board") is authorized to issue permits regulating the travel of overweight vehicles, including vehicles carrying divisible loads, on highways under the County's jurisdiction;

WHEREAS, highways for the purpose of this resolution refer to all public roads within the unincorporated areas of Morgan County, excluding federal and state highways;

WHEREAS, "divisible load" for the purpose of this resolutions refers to a vehicle or load that can be divided into separate or different parts in less than eight work hours without compromising the intended purpose of the vehicle or load or rendering it unable to perform the functions for which it was intended;

WHEREAS, the cost of maintenance and repair resulting from the impact of overweight vehicles upon the County's highways is significant;

WHEREAS, in order to mitigate the damage caused by the impacts of overweight vehicles on the County's highways, the Board hereby desires to adopt a permitting process and fee schedule for overweight vehicles carrying divisible loads;

WHEREAS, pursuant to C.R.S. § 42-4-510(11)(b) the County may impose the fees set forth in this resolution;

WHEREAS, the Board believes it would be in the best interest of public transportation to adopt an overweight vehicle permit fee schedule for vehicles carrying divisible loads;

WHEREAS, all requirements for a local authority to adopt an overweight vehicle permitting process and fee schedule as identified in C.R.S. §§ 42-4-510 and 42-4-511 have been satisfied;

WHEREAS, a public hearing on this matter was held by the Board on September 25th, 2012;

WHEREAS, the public and motor vehicle owners and operators who would be affected by the adoption of an overweight vehicle permitting process and fee schedule were notified of the public hearing and provided an opportunity to participate in such hearing; and WHEREAS, a copy of this resolution was submitted to and has been approved by the Colorado Department of Transportation.

NOW THEREFORE be it resolved by the Morgan County Board of County Commissioners that the following is now adopted:

Overweight Divisible Load Vehicle Permitting and Fee schedule

- 1. Overweight Divisible Load Vehicles—Permit Required. Any vehicle with a divisible load exceeding a total weight of eighty-five thousand (85,000) pounds shall first obtain a permit from Morgan County before traveling on any highway within the jurisdiction of the County. The maximum weight limits for divisible loads on highways within the jurisdiction of the County shall be as follows:
 - (A) Ninety-seven thousand (97,000) pounds for power units with two- or three-axle trailers; and
 - (B) One hundred ten thousand (110,000) pounds for quad-axle vehicles.

Nothing herein shall be construed to permit the operation of a vehicle exceeding the legal size limits set forth in Title 42 of the Colorado Revised Statutes, including without limitation C.R.S. §§ 42-4-502, -503, and -504.

- 2. **Fee Schedule**. Overweight Divisible Load Vehicles shall be charged a fee for traveling on highways within the jurisdiction of Morgan County as follows:
 - (A) Quad-Axle Vehicles:

Annual Permit: \$400

Annual Fleet Permit: \$2,000.00 plus \$25.00 per vehicle permitted

(B) Power Units with Two- or Three-Axle Trailers:

Annual Permit: \$300 Semi-annual Permit: \$150

Upon receipt of permit fees, ten percent (10%) shall be retained as an administrative fee to the Morgan County Clerk and Recorder's office as clerk fees to be deposited to the General Fund. Balance of fee shall be deposited to the Road and Bridge Fund.
