2025 CAPP and CWCP Renewal Highlights

Colorado Counties Casualty and Property Pool

- 50 Member Counties
- Overall contributions decreased by 2.4%, while exposure (property, revenue, vehicles, miles of road) decreased by 1.5%. Individual county increases and decreases are based on their own exposure and loss history.
- No change in coverages from 2024.

Credited \$500,000 in CAPP equity and \$975,000 of projected interest income, for a total of \$1,475,000, toward 2025 contributions.

County Workers' Compensation Pool

42 Member Counties

Overall contributions decreased by 13% while payroll increased by 10%. Individual county increases and decreases are based on their own exposure and loss history.

CWCP was able to maintain an \$875,000 per claim self-insured retention with a 2.0% rate increase over 2024.

Credited \$4.0 million in CWCP equity toward 2025 contributions.



Colorado Counties Casualty and Property Pool (CAPP) Coverage Highlights

The following are a few of the *general* CAPP coverages that we would like to highlight. The insurance policies contain the actual terms and conditions.

- Your CAPP membership covers all property (including buildings, contents, vehicles, mobile equipment, etc.) that is owned or leased by the county.
- With the exception of buildings over \$5 million, there is *no charge for mid-term additions* of buildings, vehicles, mobile equipment or other county property.
- CAPP provides **\$11 million in liability coverage and \$10 million in law enforcement liability coverage** subject to aggregates.
- Most liability claims, including auto liability, have a \$0 deductible.
- CAPP provides up to \$100,000,000 in property coverage with a few exceptions listed on the summary.
- Property and auto physical damage losses carry a *low \$1,500 deductible per occurrence*. For example, if there was a single catastrophe in which many locations and/or vehicles were damaged, you would *pay only one \$1,500 deductible*.
- CAPP provides up to *\$1,000,000* for employee dishonesty claims with a \$500 deductible.
- CAPP provides up to *\$1,000,000 per claim* in Network Liability/Cyber Coverage.

The excess insurance coverage provided through CAPP provides adequate coverage and limits for counties to perform their day-to-day operations as required by statute.
