WHEREAS, Kraft Family Dairies, LLC (the "Applicant") has an existing special use permit granted by Resolution 2006 BCC 21 for a livestock confinement facility (the "Application") located in the S½ and in the E½NE¼ of Section 27, Township 3 North, Range 57 West of the 6th P.M., Morgan County, Colorado and addressed as 13500 County Road 21, Fort Morgan, Colorado (the "Property);

WHEREAS, the Applicant has applied for amendment to the special use permit to increase allowed animal units from 9875 animal units to 15,000 animal units, and installation of an additional parlor, two free stalls, and a dry pen within the existing footprint of the dairy operations;

WHEREAS, the Applicant has concurrently applied for vested rights associated with the Application for period of eight (8) years;

WHEREAS, on September 12, 2022, after holding a duly noticed public hearing, the Morgan County Planning Commission recommended that the Application be approved;

WHEREAS, on October 4, 2022, the Board of County Commissioners (Board) held a duly noticed public hearing on the Application;

WHEREAS, during the public hearing, the Board received testimony and evidence from the Owner, Morgan County staff and the public; and

WHEREAS, the Board desires to approve the Application.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MORGAN COUNTY, COLORADO:

1. APPROVAL

- a. The Application is hereby granted. This Resolution shall constitute the special use permit (hereinafter referred to as this "Resolution" or the "Permit").
- b. The County approves vested rights for a period of eight (8) years from the date of approval of this Resolution.

2. FINDINGS OF FACT

The Board, having reviewed the application, all information provided and testimony heard, finds that:

a. The use and its location as proposed are in conformance with the Morgan County Comprehensive Plan. Specifically:

The property is located in the south central planning area as defined by the Morgan County Comprehensive Plan. The area south of County Road Q remains agriculture and there are livestock confinement facilities that must be protected and allowed to expand. In this area Comprehensive Plan goals include:

Preserve and protect existing agricultural uses south of County Road Q. The request to amend the 2006 special use permit will encourage the preservation and continuation of the industry.

- b. The application documents are complete and present a clear picture of how the use is to be arranged on the site.
- c. The Site Plan conforms to the district design standards of Section 2-420 and Section 4-200 of the Morgan County Zoning Regulations.
- d. All on and off-site impacts have been satisfactorily mitigated either through agreement, public improvement, site plan requirements or other mitigation measures.

The operation is existing and the additional impacts are expected to be minimal. Proposed use impacts upon existing uses are detailed in the included Nuisance Control Plan and in the Preliminary Environmental System Design.

e. The special use proposed has been made compatible with the surrounding uses and is adequately buffered from any incompatible uses by distance and topography.

Buffering from adjacent agricultural uses is not necessary as the proposed improvements will be within the existing dairy footprint.

- f. The special use poses no or minimal risk to the public health, safety and welfare.
- g. The amended special use proposed is located on a conforming parcel.
- h. The applicant has adequately documented a public need for the project. The applicant has submitted all pertinent technical information, has demonstrated that it has adequate financial resources to implement the project, and has paid all County fees and review costs.

i. The applicant has demonstrated a source of water which is adequate for the proposed use in terms of quantity and reliability.

3. GENERAL PROVISIONS.

- a. The Board of County Commissioners retains continuing jurisdiction over this Permit to ensure compliance with this Permit and the Morgan County Zoning Regulations. County Representatives are authorized to inspect the Property at any reasonable time upon notice to the Applicant.
- b. The Applicant shall comply with all governmental and regulatory agency requirements and permits, including without limitation those promulgated for the protection of health, safety, and welfare of the inhabitants of Morgan County. Such compliance shall include without limitation compliance with the regulations of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, the Colorado Department of Agriculture, and the United States Environmental Protection Agency.
- c. This approval is conditioned on compliance with all information and representations contained in the Application and presented by the Applicant, which are incorporated into this Resolution.
- d. This Applicant shall comply with all requirements, conditions and design standards set forth herein. Noncompliance shall be grounds for revocation of this permit by the Morgan County Board of Commissioners after notice and hearing.

Elevated Excavating - \$571,222.07

Their proposed schedule is unacceptably long, with a completion date of March 10. That alone should disqualify them, but there are also by far the highest price (more than twice the price of the low bidder).

RCD Construction - \$399.950.66

Their proposed schedule has liner installation starting on Dec 19, which is 2 weeks after the date we told them. That date may work, but it's not ideal. Their experience is geared more towards road construction and pipelaying than large earthmoving projects, and they didn't list any prior projects involving synthetic lining systems. Also, they're ~40% more expensive than the low bid.

Melvin Geib - \$297,792.66

They constructed Morgan County's Phase 1 disposal cell, and they did a very good job. Since then, they constructed another landfill disposal cell at East Regional Landfill. Of the 4 bidders they have the most landfill experience and the most experience working with synthetic lining systems. Additionally, they are the only bidder that Morgan County has previously worked with, and that prior working relationship was productive and uncontentious. They are ~5% more expensive than the low bid.

AB Underground - \$282,811.15

They are the low bid. They have experience constructing lined ponds, which are not too dissimilar to a lined landfill disposal cell. I was only able to reach one of their references: the owner of CCWCD. He was happy with their work and they completed the project on time and within budget. Geib's and AB's bids are competitive, and their proposed construction schedules are nearly identical. AB doesn't have any landfill experience, but they do have liner experience. Geib has completed 2 landfill disposal cells, both of which were overseen by AEC, and I can vouch for the quality of their work and their cooperation in working with CQA and the liner installation contractors. AEC has never worked with AB, so we cannot comment on their work.

My recommendation is to award RFP 2022-1006-001 to
